### **Purpose**

The Purpose of Project SEARCH Zoo Miami is to provide vocational training and employability skill acquisition in a workplace setting to facilitate the transition process through continuous feedback and application of new skills. The project targets students whose main goal is employment, and who will benefit from full time career exploration in a business setting. Project SEARCH is implemented through a partnership with support and resources from Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS), Miami-Dade Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Dept., Vocational Rehabilitation, and agencies providing job coaching and job development services. Through this program, students will not only develop the tools necessary for employment, but will also develop skills needed for self determination, self management and self advocacy.

## **What is Project SEARCH**

Project SEARCH Zoo Miami is a unique businessled transition program designed for students with disabilities pursuing a Special Diploma or accessing modified curriculum. It is tar-geted for students whose main goal is employ-ment and will benefit from career exploration. The cornerstone of the one school-year program is immersion into the inner workings of Zoo Miami. Individualized job development and placement occurs based on the student's experiences, strengths, and skills with the assistance of a job coach provided by Best Buddies International. Students are given support with accommodations, adaptations and on-the-job coaching. Elective credits can be awarded for successful completion of Project **SEARCH Zoo Miami. **Students must:** 

- Desire to work competitively in the community at the end of the program
- Be 18-21 years of age
- Have completed high school credits necessary for graduation
- Meet eligibility requirements for Florida Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)
- Have independent hygiene and grooming skills
- Maintain appropriate work behaviors and social skills in the workplace
- Be able to access public transportation (travel training provided by program)
- Be able to take redirection from Project SEARCH and Zoo Miami staff
